Air Force JROTC Uniform Standards

Hair-male and female standards:



- Will be <u>clean, well-groomed, present a professional</u>
 <u>appearance</u>, allow proper wear of headgear.
- Will <u>not contain excessive amounts of grooming aids</u> (e.g., gel, mousse, pomade, or moisturizer), appear lopsided, touch either eyebrow
 - * (Exception: female bangs), or end below an imaginary line across the forehead at the top of the eyebrows that is parallel to the ground.

Hair-male and female standards (con't):



- If applied, dyes, tints, bleaches, and frostings must result in natural hair colors.
- Examples of natural hair colors are brown, blonde, brunette, natural red or black.
- All Cadets are authorized to wear natural color hair regardless of their natural born hair color, but when combined or frosted, the colors must blend together so as to not present an unnatural appearance between colors.






Male (con't):



- Hair will not exceed 2 ½ inches in bulk, regardless of length and ¼ inch at natural termination point; allowing only closely cut or shaved hair on the back of the neck to touch the collar.
- Hair will not protrude under the front band of headgear.
- Cadets may have one (cut, clipped or shaved) front to back, straight-line part, not slanted or curved, on either side of their head, above the temple. Part will not exceed 4 inches length or ¼ inch width. Men are not authorized hair extensions.



Bulk is the distance that the mass of hair protrudes from the scalp. It is measured starting at the scalp and outward at a 90 degree angle.

Part will not exceed 4 inches in length or 1/4 inch in width.








Figure 3.8. Female Hair Examples.



Braided Ponytails/Multiple Braids in a Single Ponytail









- No minimum hair length, to a <u>maximum bulk of 4 inches</u> from scalp and allows proper wear of headgear.
- Hair will end above the bottom edge of collar and will not extend below an invisible line drawn parallel to the ground, both front to back and side to side unless pulled back and secured or worn in an <u>authorized ponytail or equivalent or long braid</u>(s).



- When hair is pulled back and secured behind the head it will not be gathered at the crown or worn on the top of the head.
- Radius will not exceed 6-inches to the left or right from the point where the hair is gathered for a total of 12-inches in width, 6inches in bulk.
- Must allow for proper wear of headgear



- One or two braids or a single ponytail or equivalent may be worn down the member's back with length not extending below a horizontal line running between the top of each sleeve inseam at the under arm through the shoulder blades.
- The braid(s), ponytail or equivalent shall extend down the member's back and cannot be worn over the shoulder or pulled in front of the body. Bangs, or side-swiped hair, may touch eyebrows but will not touch or cover eyes.



- Pinned-up hair should be styled in a manner that prevents loose ends from extending upward on the head and may not start at the crown of the head or be worn on the top of the head.
- When hair is in a bun, the bun must be a single bun; all loose ends must be tucked in and secured. Hair must allow for proper wear of headgear.

- Hair accessories. If worn, hair accessories (e.g., fabric scrunches, hairpins, combs, clips, headbands, elastic bands, barrettes, etc.) must be black or match hair color.
- Invisible hairnets and hairnets that match hair color are authorized. Headbands or fabric scrunches will not exceed 2inches in width. Ornaments are not authorized (i.e., ribbons, beads, jeweled pins).

Fingernails:




- Fingernails must not exceed 1/4-inch in length beyond the tip of the finger and must be clean and well groomed.
- Fingernails must not interfere with the performance or hinder proper fit of prescribed safety equipment or uniform items.

Nail polish:



If worn by **females**, nail polish will be a single conservative color that **does not detract** from the uniform. Do not apply designs to nails or apply two-tone or multitone colors; **Exception**: white-tip French manicures are authorized.

Male cadets are <u>NOT authorized</u> to wear nail polish.



Body piercings:


- ing six mm
- Female cadets are allowed to wear small (not exceeding six mm in diameter) conservative round or square white diamond, gold, white pearl, or silver earrings as a set with any uniform.
- Cadets with multiple earring holes must wear authorized earrings in the lower earlobes. Earrings will match and fit tightly without extending below the earlobe unless the piece extending is the connecting band on clip earrings.
- Transparent piercing spacers (no larger than 6mm) may be worn while in uniform.
- Male cadets are NOT authorized to wear earrings.




Health and Wellness:



- **Physical Training (PT)** includes planning weekly PT/Wellness activities, conducting the unit's Physical Fitness Test (PFT).
 - The PFT is 1 min push-ups, 1 min sit-ups, and 1 mile run.
 - The initial PFT must be accomplished within the first 45 calendar days of the school year. (completed on 9/12 & 9/13)
- PT is led and managed by our PT commander and PT technicians
 - They plan and lead exercises, as well as document scores.
- PT counts for 25% of the overall grade.


- Cadet Brandon Jarvis-Mixer Memorial CLC Scholarship




